BULKY ITEMS

The City's bulky item service is intended for the occasional disposal of items such as a mattress, an appliance, furniture, carpet, gas grill, bicycle, lawn mower, etc. This service is not intended to clean out an entire house. Bulky items should be placed at the curb clear from overhead wires, trees/tree limbs, mailboxes, or other endangerments that could interfere with collection. Bulky item collection is only provided to residential customers, not businesses.

Residents may rent a red trailer to dispose of larger quantities of bulky items or clean out a house. Call 883-3111 to inquire about the rules and fee.

<u>Tires</u>: Due to State regulations, the City will not collect tires and they are not accepted at the Landfill. Tires must be taken to the County's Tire Facility at 2138 Bishop Road, Greensboro.

MEDICAL WASTE/NEEDLES

No medical waste or needles should be placed in your garbage cart or recycling container. This creates an extreme safety hazard for our employees.

The City provides **FREE** sharps collection to City residents. Just place needles in an approved sharps container (<u>no milk jugs or plastic bottles</u>) and call 883-3111 to schedule a collection. Sharps containers may be purchased from most drug stores and pharmacies at minimal cost.

The City will collect the sharps container from your home at <u>no</u> <u>charge</u>, then safely and properly

dispose of the needles while protecting our employees.



HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE AND E-WASTE (ELECTRONICS)

The City Landfill does not accept household hazardous waste (HHW). HHW includes items such as antifreeze, brake fluid, car batteries, cleaners, gasoline, motor oil & filters, liquid paints, poisons, pesticides, solvents, transmission fluid, weed killer, and etc. These items **should not** be included in your weekly garbage collection. Below are some tips & recommendations for your HHW.

- Paints may be dried by using cat litter or allowing the paint to dry in the can - dried paint is OK to dispose of in your regular garbage - lids must be off.
 - All other HHW should be taken to ECOFLO.

Residents are encouraged to recycle e-waste (computers, monitors, printers, cell phones, TVs, etc.). Below are some tips on handling your e-waste.

- TVs, computers, cell phones and other electronic components may be recycled at ECOFLO.
- Computer components may also be taken to Goodwill Stores for FREE and office supply stores (fee may apply). Call ahead to check requirements.

High Point residents may drop-off these materials at the ECOFLO Collection Center, 2750 Patterson Ave., Greensboro (336-373-2196). Hours are Wed-Fri, 10 a.m. - 6 p.m. & Sat 8 a.m. - 2 p.m.
